**V. Animal Health Attestations**

I, the undersigned, certify that the horse described above meets the following requirements:

- a. The horse has been residing in the country specified above for \_\_\_\_\_ (number) days.
- b. The horse described was inspected on the premises listed above on \_\_\_\_\_ (mm/dd/yyyy) and found to be free of contagious diseases and, insofar as can be determined, not exposed to communicable or contagious diseases immediately preceding exportation, during the indicated period of residency.
- c. The horse has not been vaccinated with a live, attenuated or inactivated vaccine during the period of residency if within 14 days preceding exportation to the United States.
- d. That, insofar as I can determine, African horse sickness, dourine, glanders, surra, epizootic lymphangitis, ulcerative lymphangitis, equine piroplasmiasis, equine infectious anemia (EIA), contagious equine metritis (CEM), vesicular stomatitis, or Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis has not occurred on the residing premises during the period of residency, nor have these diseases occurred on any adjoining premises during the same period of time.
- e. The horse was examined and found to be free of ectoparasites.
- f. APHIS recognizes the country of residency as free of African Horse Sickness.<sup>2</sup>

**VI. CEM Attestations:**

- a. During the indicated period of residency listed, the horse did not have any contact, breeding or otherwise, with horses from a premises affected with CEM or horses found to be affected with CEM.<sup>2,3</sup>

**VII. Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) Attestations:**

- a. APHIS considers the country of residency free of FMD.<sup>1,2</sup>

OR

- b. APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be affected with FMD and the horse will reside in \_\_\_\_\_ (country), an APHIS recognized FMD-free country,

for a minimum of 5 days prior to export to the United States.<sup>1,2,4</sup>

### VIII. Screwworm Attestations:

a. APHIS recognizes the country of residency as free of Screwworm.<sup>1,2</sup>

APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be affected with Screwworm and the horse will reside in \_\_\_\_\_ (country), an APHIS recognized Screwworm free country, for a minimum of 7 days before exporting to the United States. <sup>3</sup> Horses originating from an APHIS-recognized CEM-affected region are subject to additional mitigations pre-export and upon arrival to the United States. Import requirements can be found at: [USDA APHIS | Equine Imports & Exports](#).

<sup>4</sup> Horses that do not reside in an APHIS recognized FMD-affected region for a minimum of 5 days will be required to complete FMD import requirements upon arrival to the United States. Horses that do not reside in an APHIS-Recognized screwworm free country and do not receive a required examination will be required to complete screwworm import requirements upon arrival to the United States. <sup>5</sup> Horses, including their external genitalia, must be examined thoroughly. Horses may require tranquilization or sedation for the examination.

<sup>6</sup> Original wet-ink signatures are required. Supplemental health certificates may be used if the country of temporary residency is not the final exporting country to the United States. If the horse resides in multiple European Union (EU) Member States or the United Kingdom (UK)-Great Britain (England, Scotland, Wales), Northern Ireland-then a supplemental health certificate may be endorsed by the examining veterinarian only.
