V. Animal Health Attestations

I, the undersigned, certify that the horse described above meets the following requirements:

- a. The horse has been residing in the country specified above for _____ (number) day.
- b. The horse described was inspected on the premises listed above on _______(mm/dd/yyyy) and found to be free of contagious diseases and, insofar as can be determined, not exposed to communicable or contagious diseases immediately preceding exportation, during the indicated period of residency.
- c. The horse has not been vaccinated with a live, attenuated or inactivated vaccine during the period of residency if within 14 days preceding exportation to the United States.
- d. That, insofar as I can determine, African horse sickness, dourine, glanders, surra, epizootic lymphangitis, ulcerative lymphangitis, equine piroplasmosis, equine infectious anemia (EIA), contagious equine metritis (CEM), vesicular stomatitis, or Venezuelan equine encephalomyelitis has not occurred on the residing premises during the period of residency, nor have these diseases occurred on any adjoining premises during the same period of time.
- e. The horse was examined and found to be free of ectoparasites.
- f. APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be free of African Horse Sickness.²

VI. CEM Attestations

a. APHIS recognizes the country of residency free of CEM and during the indicated period of residency listed, the horse did not have any contact, breeding or otherwise, with horses from a premises affected with CEM or horses found to be affected with CEM.^{1,2}

- b. APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be affected with CEM and insofar as I can determine the horse: ^{1,2}
 - has been held separate and apart from all other horses except for the time it was actually participating in an event or was being exercised by its trainer;
 - has not been on any premises where horses were held or used for breeding purposes;

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- has not been bred, either live or artificial, nor had other sexual contact or genital examination while residing in the above country;
- has been transported only in cleaned and disinfected vehicles and was not accompanied by any other horse of a different health status.

VII. Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) Attestations:

- a. APHIS recognizes the country of residency free of FMD.^{1,2} OR
- b. APHIS recognizes the country of residency to be affected with FMD and the horse will reside in an APHIS recognized FMD-free country, for a minimum of 5 days prior to export to the United States.^{1,2}

APHIS recognizes that the country of residency, or any country resided in within five (5) days of export to the US, to be affected with FMD and the mitigations as outlined in "SCREWWORM AND FMD DECLARATION: VETERINARY EXPORT HEALTH CERTIFICATE ADDENDUM LONGINES OCALA 2025" have been OR will be performed and certified to and attached to this supplemental. ^{1,2}

- a. APHIS recognizes the country of residency as free of Screwworm.^{1, 2} OR
- b. APHIS recognizes that the country of residency, or any country resided in within seven (7) days of export to the US, to be affected with Screwworm and the mitigations as outlined in in *"SCREWWORM AND FMD DECLARATION: VETERINARY EXPORT HEALTH CERTIFICATE ADDENDUM LONGINES OCALA 2025"* have been OR will be performed and certified to and attached to this supplemental. ^{1,2}
